


Combining great wine, fine art, special dogs and worthy causes is what Cru Vin Dogs is all about.

Introducing Our First Puppy Series Red:

Blue Heeler"

Shiraz-Grenache-Mourvèdre Barossa Valley, South Australia



We thought you might enjoy a look behind the scenes as to how we tracked down this particular wine and the origin of the label. We were looking at three countries for our first Puppy Series red: Australia, Argentina and Spain. Having started my career in the wine business importing Australian wines way back in the early '70s, it seemed natural to go back to my roots—so to speak.

The Wine

I arrived in Adelaide, a city in South Australia surrounded by famous vineyard appellations, where I met up with wine industry veterans Mary Anne Kennedy and Mark Bolton. We set off on a weeklong journey of winery visits and tastings to find a winemaker we could work with long-term. One such meeting was extraordinary.

We dropped in at Veritas winery and met Owner/

Winemaker Rolf Binder, who Robert Parker calls one of the most talented winemakers in Australia. After tea and a discussion about upcoming rugby games, we went to Rolf's cellar to taste a variety of individual wines he still had in the barrel, and to create a blend that fit the style we were after.





Every wine I tasted was of impeccable quality, and after experimenting with different lots combined together in various percentages, we came up with a 70% Shiraz, 15% Grenache and 15% Mourvedre blend. WOW! This wine was fantastic, so I took a sample bottle with me for the Cru Vin Dogs team to taste. We then took Rolf to lunch and shared a bottle of Cru Vin Dogs 2005 Best in Show Cabernet – which I had brought along for just such an occasion – and celebrated the beginning of our new found friendship and working relationship.

After arriving back home I blind-tasted the team on Rolf's wine along with samples from two other producers I had visited. No contest—the purity of flavor and the elegance is superb.

The Breed

During my travels with Mary and Mark and others we met along the way, we discussed what breed would be a good match for this wine. The overwhelming choice was either a Red or Blue Heeler, which are cattle/ sheep herding dogs with great character. They were developed by pioneer settlers in the 1800s by crossing Dingo-blue merie Kelpies to Dalmations and black and tan Kelpies with a little Bull Terrier tossed in. An intriguing blend as is the wine itself!



The Label

Artist Jay P. Snellgrove then went on a mission to find a Red or Blue Heeler puppy for the label. Jay and his son Tristan found a Blue (10-weeks-old) just north of Denver and went to take photos and get to know its personality in order to do his pastel drawing. They were hooked after spending a few hours with the little guy and he became a part of the family about a week later!

Tristan really liked the name "Binder" for the puppy, and so it became. Of course Rolf was very honored, and he posted Binder's picture on his website (RolfBinder. com) with the caption, "My cute namesake".

All our wines have great stories like this one behind them. So know that each time you have a glass or two of Cru Vin Dogs Wine, it is the result of a lot dedicated effort and care. And best of all, it helps good causes!

Artist Corner

Cru Vin Dogs is honored to have Jay P. Snellgrove as our label artist. In addition to the wine labels Jay illustrates for us, his pieces are permanently exhibited at the Denver Museum of Nature and Science and at Invesco Field, home of the Denver Broncos Football Team (Jay has illustrated all Bronco Alumni inducted into the prestigious "Ring of Fame"). He has created posters for various National Specialty Dog Shows and has been commissioned to illustrate high profile Champion dogs.

Most recently, Jay has been selected by Duckhorn Wine Company to be the featured label artist for their 2007 Paraduxx release coming in February, 2010.

Many of our customers are interested in learning more about Jay's background and artistic style so we posed some of the questions they've been asking of him:

What got you interested in art?

JPS: I've always been interested in drawing...in fact, I used to get into trouble in grammar school when I got caught doodling in class.

My brother and I used to walk barefoot along the banks of Cherry Creek and we'd come across all sorts of critters that I'd take home and then draw. We also did a lot of camping as a family and I couldn't wait to get home and learn how to draw some of the birds

of prey we saw. That's when I really got interested

in scientific illustration.

Did you go to art school?

JPS: I took a lot of art classes in high school and graduated from Colorado State University where I studied illustration and graphic design.

Tell us about the medium you work with...

JPS: When I was at CSU, I learned from an art professor that textured paper was ideal for scientific illustration. I also found that working with graphite pencil and pastel pencil enhances the almost photographic effect I try to achieve with my illustration style.

What's the hardest part of what you do?

JPS: Getting started! And knowing when the illustration is done so I'm not tempted to overwork it.
